	<p>The minutes of the previous meeting were read and agreed to be a true and accurate record, with the following amendment.</p> <p>In light of new information that has become available, Cllrs ratified the decision to rescind the comments made against planning application DET/2021/0038 – Bagnall Green Farm.</p>

County Councillor Reports

- Cllr Flunder has arranged a public consultation meeting for 20 January 2022, with representatives from SCC Highways, WPD, and Prysmian Cables & Systems.
- Meetings with Highways have been undertaken in relation to the Maintenance of roads through Bagnall following Phase 1 of the WPD Cellarhead Project. The outcome of which has been that Highways are happy to repair damage to the road surface and any gullies, but not the grass verges.
- Repairs to Springs Bank around the ford has been agreed as a priority, with some works being undertaken on Thorney Edge Lane and School Road.
- In relation to potholes, these are only dealt with by the Highways department when they are 150mm deep. Highways only undertakes repairs to the road surface; verge damage is deemed as down to inappropriate road usage and not the responsibility of Highways.
- A programme of road gully/drain cleaning has commenced. Cllr Batson stated that the drains/gullies within the Parish had not been cleaned for over three years and asked that the village be given priority.
- In relation to the weight restrictions being requested by Cllrs, SCC is willing to issue the temporary legal order, but would need assurance that the police are able to undertake enforcement and that the Parish Council would be willing to pay the costs, estimated at £1,840.00. Cllrs felt it was inappropriate to divert any of our funds for this purpose as roads fell under the responsibility of the Highways Department. Cllr Flunder agreed to take back our views.
- The issue of speeding traffic through Salter's Wells will be reviewed by DHP once the road works have been completed.
- The issue of no vaccination stations within Staffordshire Moorlands for COVID booster jabs has been raised, although currently there is nothing planned due to the low number of cases.

The closing date for responses is 31 January 2022, and to date a small number of responses have been received. A full report will be provided at the next meeting. ▪ Planning Review The Clerk submitted a paper on all the successful planning applications over the past year, detailing the conditions applied to each. Cllrs will undertake a rolling review of these and future applications to ensure that planning conditions are adhered to and any non-compliance challenged appropriately.
21.43	Roles and Responsibilities
	<p>To ensure that Cllrs were up to date with the current attributes and responsibilities of being a councillor the Clerk provided them with a link to the latest <i>Good Councillor Guide</i> for reference. Cllrs were also reminded that any decisions taken outside of meetings needed to be brought back to the next available meeting for ratification and to keep the Clerk duly informed of all discussions or issues reported directly (highways issues, etc).</p> <p>Cllr Knowles, as Chair, gave an overview of the direction he wished the Parish Council to go in and his proposed changes to the way the Parish Council operates. Cllrs gave him a vote of confidence and agreed to his proposals.</p>

	<p><i>Matters Arising from Previous Minutes</i> 19.74.04 – Website Cllr Knowles presented a quotation of £499.00 for a replacement website, there is an additional £100 for the copying over of our current website ‘as is’. This was agreed.</p>

21.32.07 – Bank Account

The bank account has now been moved, and our reserves placed in a savings account.

New Issues

21.44.01 – Quarter 3 Financial Report

The Clerk tabled the report which stated that on 31 December 2021 the Parish Council's accounts stood at £16,252.52. Outstanding large expenditure is the renewal of our website and the provision of a defibrillator. The Clerk suggested at this stage that the monies for the defibrillator be diverted to the installation of electricity to the kiosk. This was agreed.

21.44.02 – Precept

The Clerk advised that a submission for a precept of £10,000 has been submitted to SMDC. This equates to an increase of £2.70 on a Band D property.

21.44.03 – Training

The Clerk informed the Parish Council that she had now completed and passed the FiLCA financial training.

The Clerk stated that her main qualification was acquired in 2004, and to bring this up to date there is a short course at a cost of £30.00 she can undertake. Cllrs were in agreed to this.

Cllr Knowles will be the lead in ensuring that an electrical supply and lighting is available for next Christmas' display.

21.29.05 – Telephone Kiosk outside Rose and Crown

The Clerk advised that Marston's Brewery agree in principle to an electrical link being set up between the public house and the kiosk. They are currently seeking the current landlord's views on this before proceeding with agreements. The Clerk will chase up for the next meeting.

In the interim Cllr Drakeley in the process of undertake a survey of the kiosk to ascertain what works are required to bring it up to standard.

The Clerk has developed a draft and Cllrs were appointed to lead on the various current projects, assisted by other Cllrs/volunteers as appropriate. In the future this Plan will be driven by parishioners who will be asked to submit projects for consideration in the Spring.</p>

	<p><i>Matters arising from previous minutes</i></p> <p>20.51.02 – Egress of water onto carriageway, Clewloes Bank This issue has now been resolved.</p> <p>21.21.01 – WPD Cellar Head Project During discussions with Cllr Flunder the issue of whether weight restrictions applied to agricultural vehicles was raised. Cllr Batson agreed to look at the relevant legislation with SCC and Cllr Flunder together with that relating to the placement of temporary traffic lights.</p> <p>Should weight restrictions not apply to agricultural vehicles Cllrs would prefer these to be attached to Springs Bank on a permanent basis.</p> <p>In relation to road signage, Cllrs felt that it would be more useful to state “<i>no access to Milton</i>” for example, rather than using road names. Cllr Batson will liaise with contractors.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Action: Cllr Batson</p> <p>21.35.01 – S.53 Applications The Clerk has written to SCC to express our dissatisfaction at their response which has left us in limbo. There is nothing further the Parish Council can do, any pressure to prioritise must come from the applicant.</p> <p><i>New Issues</i></p> <p>21.46.01 – S.53 application – Footpath 32 The Parish Council has received notification from Cllr Flunder that an application has been submitted to SCC to redefine Footpath 32 as a bridleway. The closing date for comments is 29 January 2022. As the Parish Council has not received any official notification from SCC, the Clerk was asked to write for an extension.</p>
