An email was sent to outline the options available inc planning permission or removal of the new half of the stables. We await an update of what the landowner intends to describe the landowner intends to describe the landowner. The additional stable constructed by the new land owner is next to but not connected to the existing stable is less than 4yrs old, so is current the target of a planning enforcement investigation. The land owner was advised what a field shelter is, as having only 3 sides which has to be moved around the field on a yearly basis to allow the land to recove Also, after making an appointment to discuss the situation with a planning office the owner was advised a field shelter elsewhere on the larger field would not require planning permission. Greenbelt land is not a consideration in regards to a field shelter not require planning permission, but would be a consideration if a planning application was submitted. If a planning application is not submitted there in nothing the Paris Council can support or object to with regards to planning conservations.
